Art Gottlieb, LCSW, CSA

Friday December 22nd from 1:30pm to 2:30pm

Pseudo Dementia is any decline in thinking & behavior, where it is falsely presumed (promoted by age-related stereotypes), that the sources of those symptoms must be the onset of dementia. This program will discuss the factors leading to a potential misdiagnosis of dementia such as: sensory deficits, side effects of medication, alcohol consumption, depression, nutritional deficits, environmental factors and medical disorders that can affect cognition and behavior.

Historical Presentation

SEARS, ROEBUCK & COMPANY

Presented by Art Gottlieb Friday, December 1st at 1:30pm

This venerable chain of department stores founded by Richard Warren Sears and Alvah Curtis Roebuck in 1892 began as a mail ordering catalog company. As late as 1989 Sears still held the distinction of being the largest retailer in the US. Despite diversifying into other markets, after 2010 the company was no longer profitable. Sadly, but not unexpectedly, Sears filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy protection on October 15, 2018. This program will include a slide presentation of the history of Sears, sure to inspire conversation and remembrances.





RECREATION PROGRAMS

Art Class & Chair Yoga are FREE classes made possible because of the Title III grants. Art class is held monthly and delves into a variety of projects. Chair Yoga, designed for seniors who want to exercise gently, is held Thursdays at 2:00pm.

CHORE SERVICE

As part of the Title III grant, we can help Monroe seniors who have difficulty, financially or physically, completing any of the chore services listed: heavy housework, yard work, minor home repairs, etc. Veronica Jensen, Elderly Services Coordinator or Mary Ann Kalm, Social Services Coordinator, will review your request, complete your form 5 and match you with one of the vendors who signed on as part of this program.

TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

CAREGIVER INFORMATION & ASSISTANCE

Veronica Jensen, Elderly Services Coordinator & Mary Ann Kalm, Social Service Coordinator, provide case management for Caregivers. Both serve as a single point of entry for seniors, their family members and caregivers on a variety of programs, services and support. They will assess client needs and match them with appropriate programs, including but not limited to: energy assistance, S.N.A.P., Farmer Market Coupons, Connecticut Homecare Program for the Elderly, Veteran's Aid and Attendance Benefit, Respite Care, etc.

CAREGIVER PUBLIC INFORMATIONAL SERVICE

Title III grants allows us to continue our monthly information series on a variety of topics to help caregivers, family, friends, neighbors and even care recipients learn how to handle and deal with a variety of situations, issues and more.

These educational sessions are informational and interactive. They are led by Arthur Gottlieb who is a Licensed Clinical Social Worker and Certified Senior Advisor. Art has many years of clinical experience and has been working with the Center for over 12 years. If there are any topics that you would like to learn more about please let us know and we will be sure to add it to Art's calendar.

CAREGIVER SUPPORT GROUP

This is a new program being offered for our caregivers as part of the Title III grant we were awarded! We know caregiver stress is real! If you are a caregiver and are feeling stressed, isolated, overwhelmed or depressed this support group can help! This program will help you develop lifestyle changes and offer strategies for creating a life that, despite the daily stressors and emotions of caregiving, remains balance and meaningful! The group will be led by Arthur Gottlieb, LCSW, CSA in the center's library which offers a confidential and calm setting, where caregivers can open up and express their normal frustrations for caregiving and receive non-judgmental advice and suggestions. Group dates and times will be listed in the Center Newsletter.

DONATIONS

As part of the Title III grants we are asked to seek donations for the various programs and services.
